

Highlights from the June Meeting of the Executive Council

Caroline LaVopa, Christian Education Coordinator reported that the Trustees have approved moving Sunday School classes. Nursery and Pre-school will move to where Caroline's office presently is; K-3 will remain in the Studio, and 4th and 5th grades will move to the art room. Caroline's office will move to Room 7.

Dennis Murphy and Terry Burke, from the Property Task Force, reported that the house adjacent to the Red Barn is still on the market. It was recently featured in an article in *Newsday*, and the realtor continues to have almost weekly open houses. Several offers have been made and withdrawn after inspection. It is now featured as a potential Bed and Breakfast.

Bruce Texeira, from the Investment Task Force stated that the Attorney General has given the church relief from the investment covenant on the Wicks bequest. The Task Force has met with two investment advisors regarding future investments. All other stipulations of the Wick's will remain in place.

Charlaine Apsel reported for the Constitution and By-Laws Task Group. Copies of the latest draft of the proposed changes to the Constitution and Article I of the By-Laws were distributed to the Council, requesting feedback from the Council to the Task Group.

Bruce Texeira, reporting for the Board of Christian Outreach, reported that Carol Wiebelt continues to organize work parties at the Sunrise Prevention Center in Pt. Jefferson. The Board is continuing to investigate becoming a Sanctuary Church.
